

This Surrey house underwent a comprehensive structural remodel to transform an eccentric layout into a spacious, bright open-plan living area, achieved by merging rooms and strategically using steel frames. Key interventions included innovative ceiling treatments to maximize space and light, relocating and integrating storage into a newly designed plywood staircase, and removing obstructive chimney breasts to enhance natural illumination.





3. Diagrammatic View


Brent Cross South - Mixed Use Masterplan, London




